## **Section 504 Annual Notice**

Section 504 Of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, (Section 504) prohibits the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI) from discriminating against members of the public on the basis of disability in its conducted programs and activities. Section 504 defines a person with a disability as anyone who:

- Has a mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities;
- A record of such an impairment; or
- Being regarded as having such an impairment

Pursuant to Section 504, the Bureau of Indian Education (BIE) operated schools are responsible for locating and providing accommodations and services to eligible students with disabilities. BIE has developed in the Indian Affairs Manual (IAM), Part 30, Chapter 15, Education (Management), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, to provide guidance to its employees and information to students, parents, and other providers of educational services on its Section 504 responsibilities.
